Diary Writing - We will develop our recount skills by way of writing diary entries from the perspective of a child from the Brazilian favelas and from a time traveller's journal. Spelling: We will continue to focus hard on improving our spelling ability, using patterns and rules, along with using our knowledge of the root word as a method to increase our competence in spelling unfamiliar words. Our Class novel is 'The Time Machine' by H.G. Wells.


