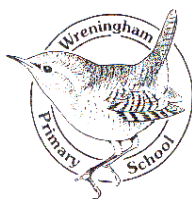

Dear Parents,

## **P.E. Kit**

On days where children have PE, or are attending an after-school SPORTS club, they must come in the following PE kit: white t-shirt, school red jumper or cardigan - this is for wearing in class if feeling cold (not in PE lessons); black shorts or black tracksuit bottoms, trainers/plimsoles.

IN ADDITION - they need an additional fleece or hoodie to replace their red jumper/cardigan in the actual lesson if it is chilly/rainy (fleeces /hoodies are not allowed to be worn in the classroom).

When the school is finally able to lift the covid restrictions it operates under, we will continue to allow children to wear their PE kits on the days they have PE.

## Free School Meals FSM – Pupil Premium Funding Reminder

We are aware that some people's circumstances may have changed as a result of the pandemic. Your child may now be eligible for the pupil premium grant which entitles them to extra support in school as well as a universal FSM. Please note you do not have to apply for universal free school meals - all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who are attending school are entitled to receive one.

However, **parents can apply for the school to get extra funding from the Government called Pupil Premium, if you receive one of the benefits listed below:**

Universal Credit - with an annual earned income of no more than £7,400 after tax, Income Support, Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance, Income-related Employment and Support Allowance, the guaranteed element of Pension Credit, Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for the four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit), Child Tax Credit (with no Working Tax Credit) with an annual gross income of no more than £16,190
