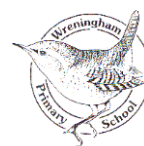

Dear Parents,

The announcement that all children will be back at school for September is really welcome and the school is busy planning the new class sized bubbles for children, deciding curricula that will help pupils catch up quickly on any lost learning and planning staggered start, finish and break times. YEAR 2 TRANSITION DAYS – MONDAY 20 JULY & TUESDAY 21 JULY

The year 2 children need to be dropped off 9AM by either the top entrance nearest the school (follow the path in and exit via the staff carpark) or by the far entrance (parents can enter into the school grounds up to the orange fencing). Pick up time is 3PM. We ask that children wear their school uniform and bring a packed lunch (no school bags please). They can bring a pencil case with a couple of pencils, a rubber, a pencil sharpener and a set of colouring pencils and/or felt tips. The children will be based in class 3. The teachers are all really looking forward to welcoming the year 2 pupils back into school.

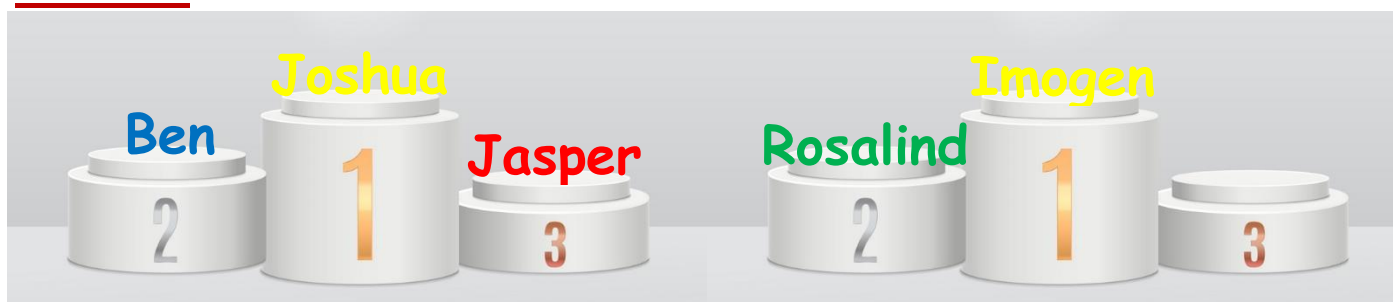

On Canada Day Bubble 4 tried out some Inuit art.



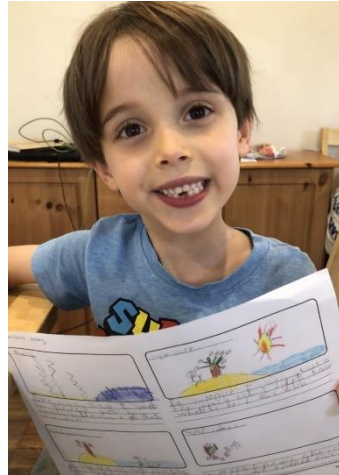
Bubble 1 have been busy this week playing phonics games, making volcanoes, finding patterns outside and 'Sharing a Shell' puppet shows.

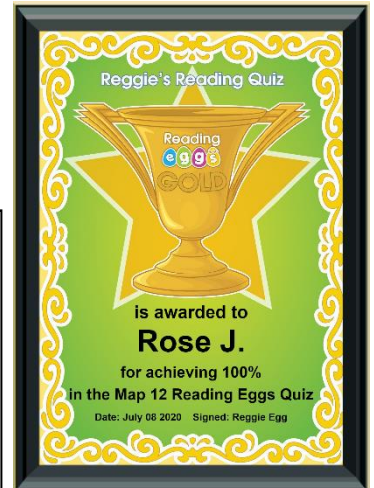
A fantastic story and 2 teeth lost during lockdown!
