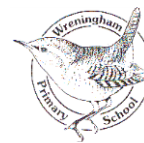

Dear Parents,

We hope you are all continuing to stay safe and well. It's been a good second week back with Year R, 1, 6 pupils and keyworker children in school and I want to thank everyone involved in making it a success. I am sure you are aware that last Monday the Secretary of State for Education announced that schools would *not* be able to welcome all primary children back for a full month before the summer. We await further guidance this weekend from the government. I do want to reassure families that we are very mindful a significant number of our school children are not yet able to come back and that they are very much in our minds.

For those families with children in school, please remember to send them in with only a snack and, if in Year 6 or a keyworker, with a packed lunch - no bags or other items from home. We cannot have items going to and from school for your, and our, safety. Also, as part of the school's risk assessment, I have to confirm that parents must inform the teaching staff about their child's health on arrival to school if they have any concerns or anxieties.

Many families have established a routine with home learning and children have risen to the occasion and so much good work is being completed - please continue to send us your brilliant photos. The school has been keeping in touch with families both through feedback to work being emailed, with Year R Tapestry and with phone calls. Should you have any worries or concerns please ring the school office.

We are planning for September as though we will have the whole school back, particularly with regards to the phased induction of our new Reception children and will adapt these plans if we have to in line with any updated DfE guidance.

Contact Details

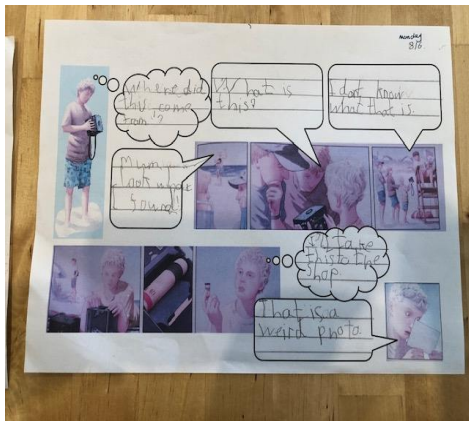


It is more important than ever that you ensure we have your most up to date details to contact you in the case of an emergency – and to keep you up to date with our plans.

HOME LEARNING

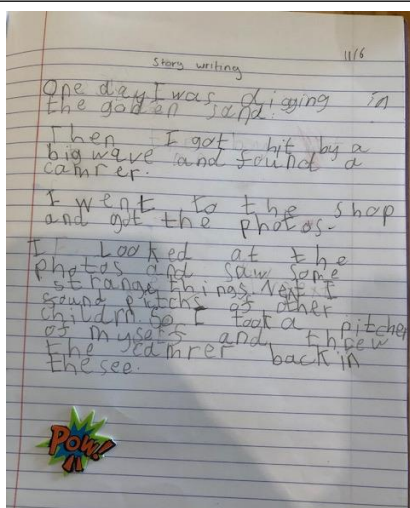
Ava was really excited to receive a new book. She practised her finger rhymes and feels like she is a Year 1 now!



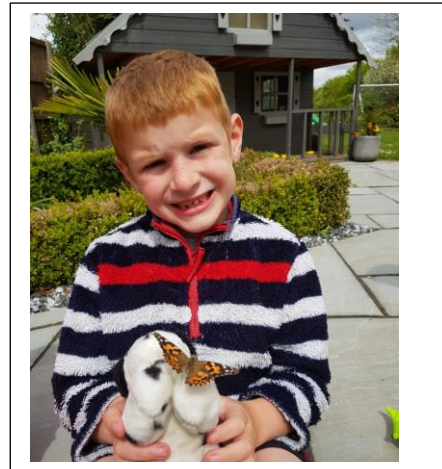
This is Ben's writing – it's his own version of the story Flotsam. He used the story board to help think about what the characters might be thinking and saying.
