- If it is raining the school will re-schedule the event for the afternoon at 2PM
- Parents should arrive and exit at the lower/far school entrance.
- We have no toilet facilities for parents.

The Year 6 pupils should be in school at the start of the school day as usual. After the leavers' assembly the Year 6 pupils will remain in school for a party in their class. I look forward to seeing as many of you as possible as we say goodbye to these children as they move on to their next chapter. The school will open for the remaining groups/bubbles of children as normal.
