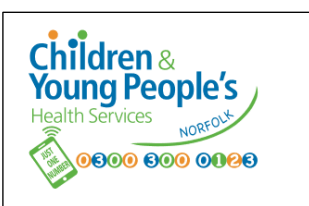

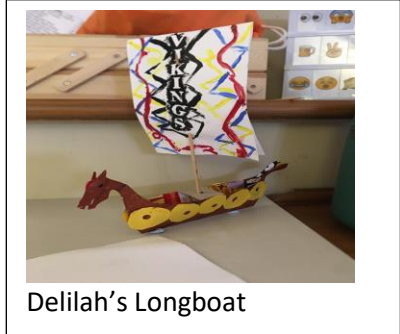
Well done to the children for all the work they have done this week online.

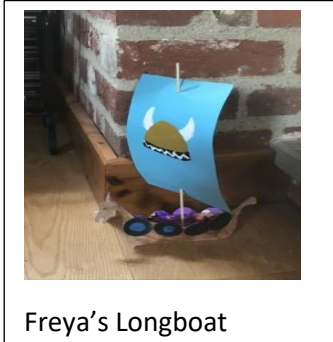
Samuel's Longboat

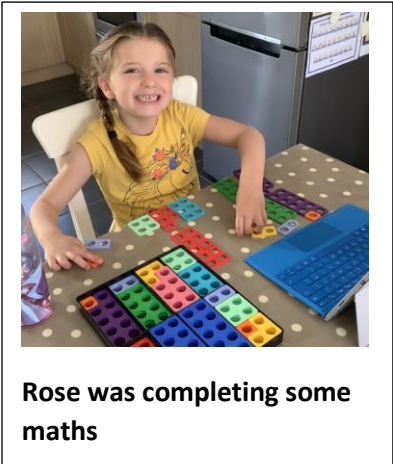

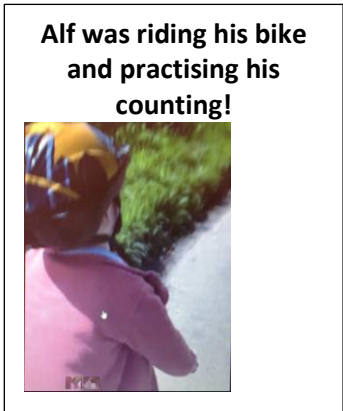


Imogen was reading a poem to Ms Leader (Don't Put Mustard in the Custard by Michael Rosen)
