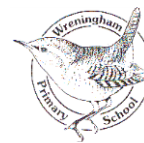




## Wreningham CE VC Primary School Weekly Newsletter

- egg in water: no changes to the egg shell

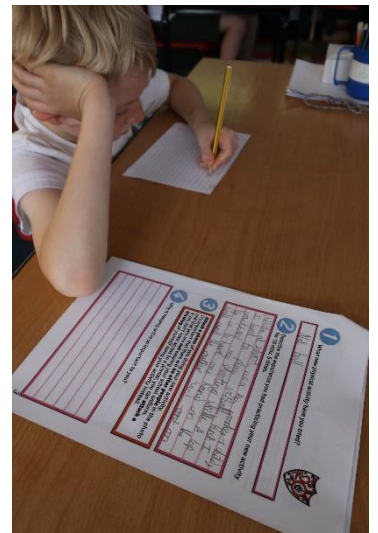

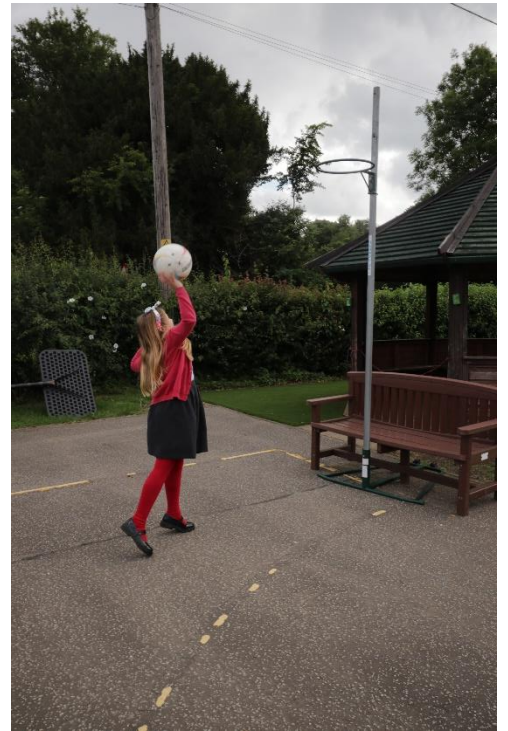

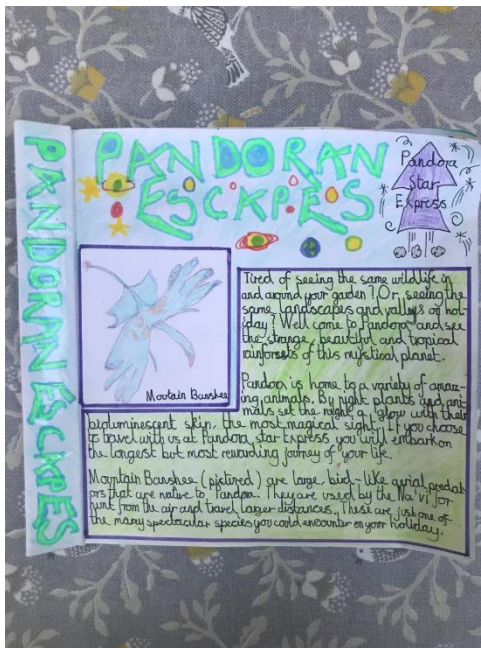
