Geography, Computing

Where would you like to travel to?

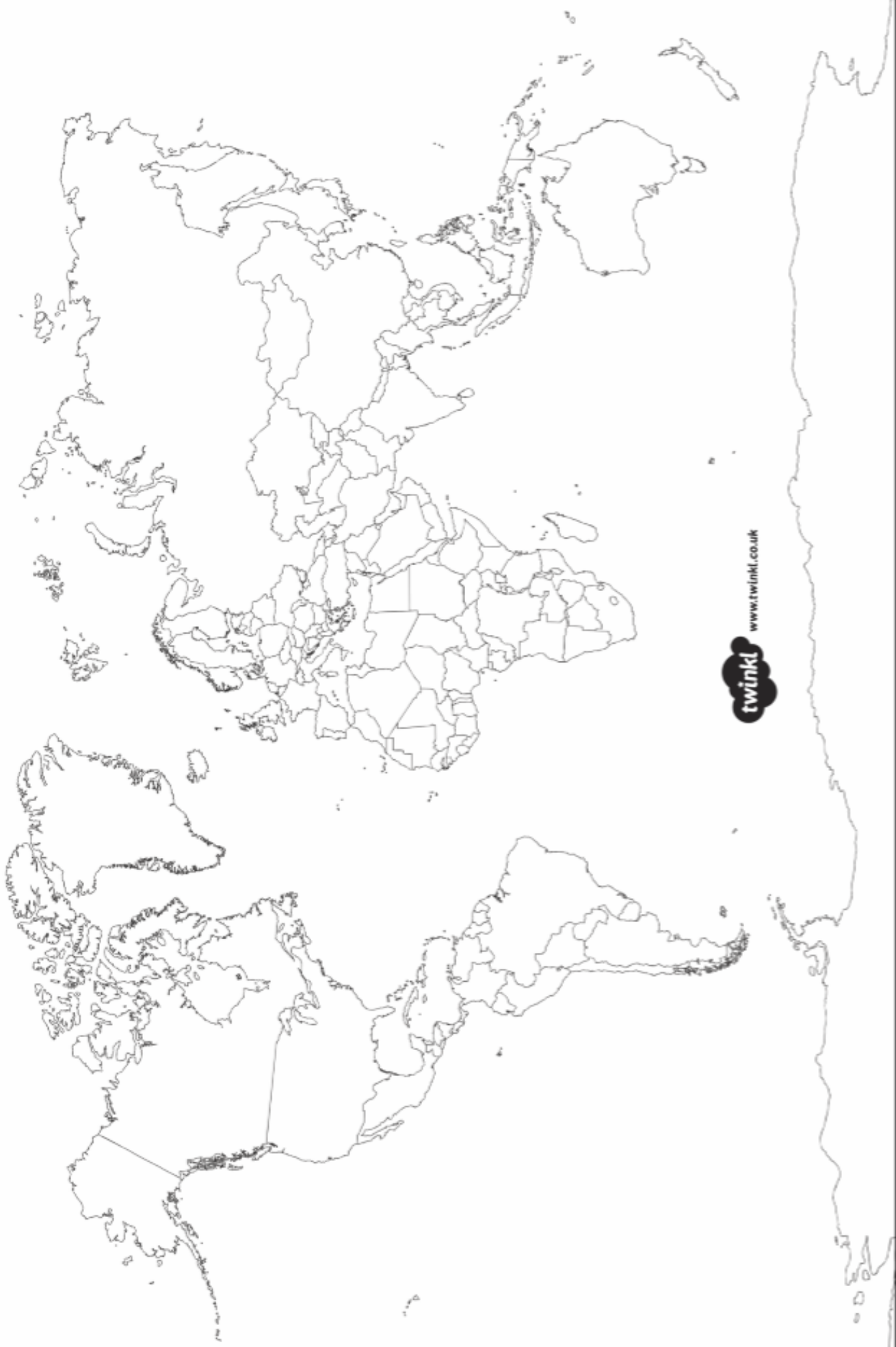
- Using Google Maps, Google Earth and/or an atlas, research where you would like to go. Is there just one city or country, or several?
- Write the destination(s) in a list.
- If there are cities on your list, include the country and continent where it's located (example: Norwich, UK, Europe).
- Link with **literacy**: write why you would like to visit each destination.
- Link with **literacy**: write a short description of each of the destinations on your list.
- If you have access to a printer, can you plot each of the cities on a world map? A blank world map is included on the next page.

Which landmarks would you like to see/visit in each country or city?

- For example, if you would like to visit Rome, would the Colosseum be on your list?
- Write a list of each of the landmarks or places you would like to visit.
- Link with **literacy**: Write a short description about each of the landmarks/places. You could write about its **history** and why you would like to visit it.
- Which category would your landmark or destination fall into: human geography or physical geography?

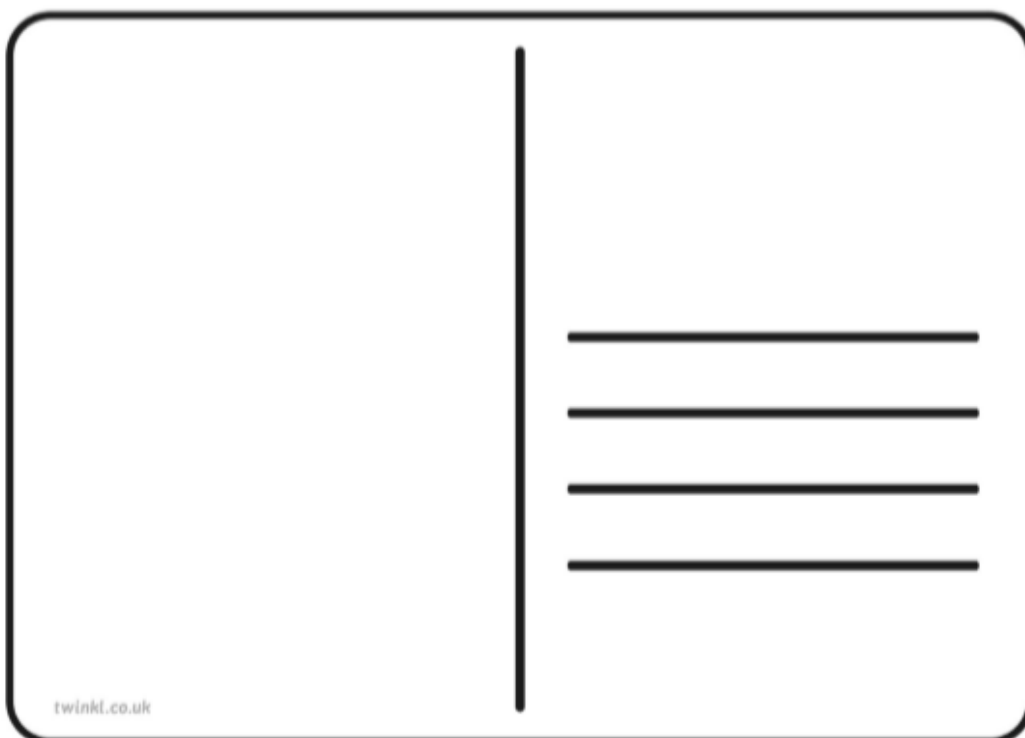
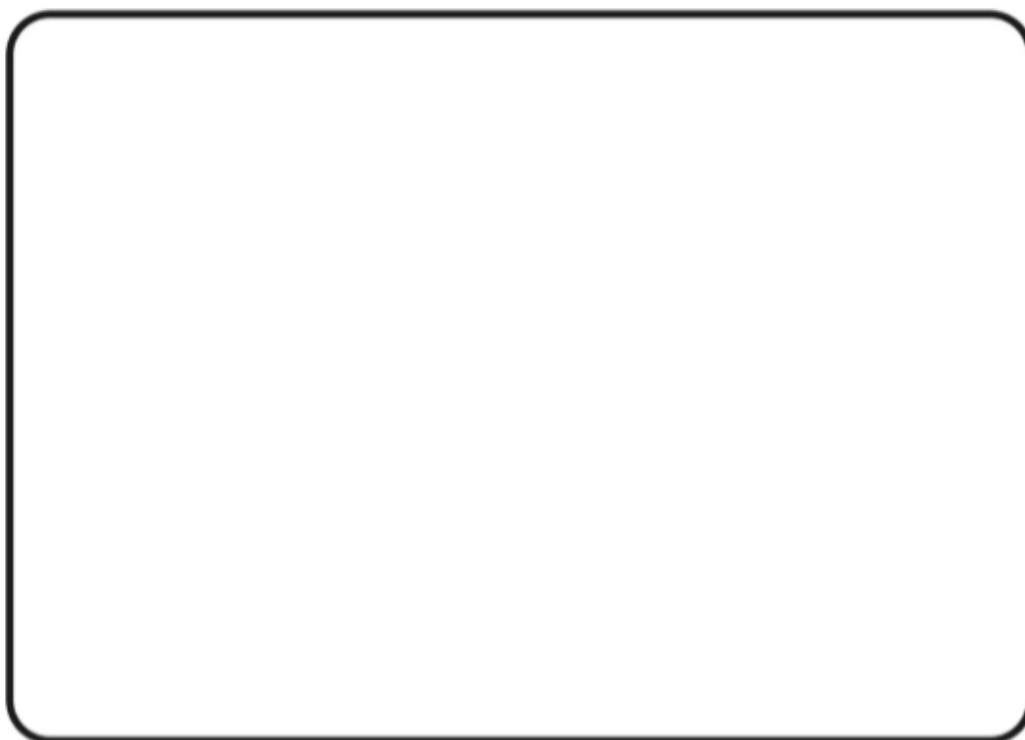
Passport

- If you need a passport, why not see if you can find a passport application online?
- If you're able to, print it and have a go at filling it in.
- Otherwise, just read through it with an adult and discuss why you think they need the information they're asking for.

Literacy continued...

Write postcards

- Who would you send a postcard to?
- Which destination would you send your postcard(s) from?
- Design and write your own postcard(s).



Maths

You have an unlimited budget! Remember to calculate the total cost once you have finished planning your dream holiday. What would the cost then be per person?

Passports

- Do you need a passport? Does your passport need renewing?
- Do your friends or family need a passport? Or, do their passports need renewing?
- How much will this cost per person and in total?

Pre-trip purchases

- Will you need to buy anything before you leave? Clothes? Toiletries? Suitcases? Etc? Make a list of what you will need and what they will cost.

While you are travelling

- How will you travel to London? How much will it cost? Remember to think about your return journey (eg. London to home).
- How will you travel from destination to destination (plane, train, coach, boat, etc)? How much will each journey cost?
- Where will you stay? List your accommodation, how many nights you will be staying and the total cost for each hotel/resort/etc.
- How much money will you allow for food and drink each day?

Once you're home

- Will you want to make a photo book?
- Will there be anything else you need to spend money on?

Maths continued...

Travel time

- How long will it take to travel from destination to destination?
- What are your departure and arrival times?
- This will vary depending on which method of transport you choose (plane, train, coach, boat, etc.).

Time zones

- Upon your arrival at each of your destinations, what would the time be in Wreningham?
- Remember to write your arrival time in local time, the time in Wreningham and the time difference.
- Example: I arrived in Ottawa, Canada at 5pm. The time in Wreningham is 10pm. The time difference in Ottawa is -5 hours from Greenwich Mean Time (GMT).

Money

- What is the local currency in each of your destinations? For example, Canadian Dollar, Euro, Swiss Franc, Russian Rouble, etc.
- While planning, you have made the decision to allow £1,000 of spending money in each destination. What would this amount be in local currency? Example: £1 = \$1.72 Canadian, so £1,000 = \$1,720 Canadian.

Modern Foreign Languages (MFL)

In each of your destinations,

- What language is spoken?
- Can you translate hello, goodbye, please, thank you and any other words you think might be useful.
- For single words, Google Translate could help.

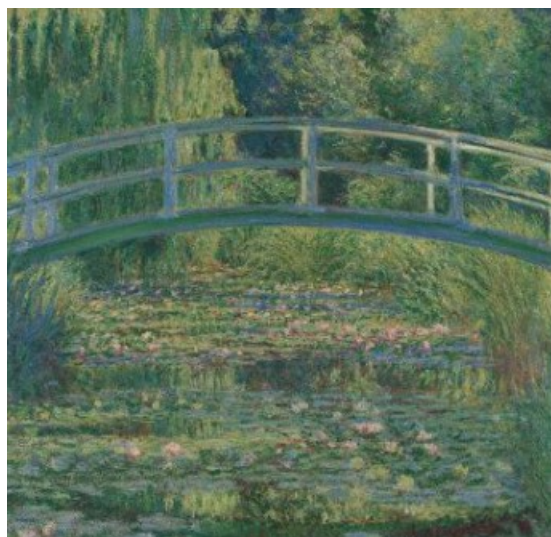
Art

Find a picture of a landmark you wish to visit.

- Sketch it in your art book, or on a plain piece of paper.
- Cut out your sketch and stick it in your topic book. Write a caption (think about what you wrote under the pictures in your newspaper article).

Research a well-known artist linked to a country you would like to visit.

- Can you re-create one of their art works?
- What medium will you use (eg. paint, watercolour, colouring pencils, nature, etc.)?
- Example: If you would like to travel to France, can you re-create Monet's 'The Water-Lily Pond'?
