Choice #1: Write a lockdown poem

You are all really good at writing poetry, so this is your task for this week. Have a go at writing a poem about your lockdown experience. Below are the suggested steps you could take.

Step #1: write on pieces of paper or post-it notes the following:

- What have you been doing to keep busy? (school work, bike rides, walks, board games, reading, making Viking longboats, FaceTime with friends, etc.)
- What have you been feeling? (happy, sad, frustrated, thankful, etc.)
- What would you like to do when restrictions are loosened even more? (give your family and friends hugs, go on a holiday outside of the UK, go on a holiday in the UK, go to a restaurant, etc.)

Step #2: place your pieces of paper or post-it notes in whatever order you think is best.

Step #3: take each idea and write it into a phrase. Remember, your poem does not have to rhyme. Please just remember capital letters at the beginning of each phrase! You may not need a full stop/exclamation mark/question mark at the end of each phrase; read your poem out loud and then put a full stop in when you come to a 'natural' pause.

Try to include the following:

- powerful and interesting verbs, adjectives and adverbs
- alliteration
- similes
- personification
- onomatopoeia
